## **Butler Collaborative for Families**

## October 11, 2018

- I. The meeting was called to order by Elan and all members were asked to introduce themselves, after which John McCool recited our mission.
- II. Approval of September Meeting Minutes- Motion by Jeanie, second by John. All in favor.
- III. Reminder: Mini-Grant applications are due on October 31, 2018!
- IV. Open BCF Executive Positions
  - a. The below positions are open and nominations are being accepted. Voting will take place at the next general meeting. A brief description of each position was provided.
    - i. Co-Chair- Josh S. was nominated (was not present to accept)
    - ii. Education Rep-Karen Jack was nominated
    - iii. Co Vice-Chair-Ivory was nominated but respectfully declined. Courtney McConnell was nominated. Rebecca Keller was nominated but was not able to serve on the executive committee because she works at CCR, the BCF fiduciary.
    - iv. Secretary-Amy can be reelected was nominated
    - v. Family Rep-Caitlin can be reelected was nominated
    - vi. Treasurer- Jan can be reelected and was nominated
    - vii. Business Rep-Jim S. can be reelected and was nominated
    - viii. Community Rep-John can be reelected and was nominated
- V. Presenter- Christopher Garnett and Ashley Chung, Jewish Healthcare Foundation (JHF)
  - a. Part of the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program. JHF is a Fiscal Agent for Part B funding to provide social services to those who are living with HIV/AIDS.
  - b. Located in Pittsburgh but partners with CCR to offer support groups and non-medical case management for HIV positive individuals in Butler.
  - c. They provide training, coaching, budgeting, learning sessions, community engagement, regional collaboration, and a variety of other services to the southwest PA counties.
  - d. Developed and participates in the Regional HIV Collaborate. Regional agencies meet every other month and their goal is to strengthen the continuum of care and to provide education and awareness.
  - e. Ryan White Learning Collaborative- formed to improve HIV prevention and care by increasing shared knowledge. Target audience is any case manager working with those living with HIV/AIDS.
  - f. AIDS Free Pittsburgh: An Allegheny County Initiative goals are to normalize HIV testing, increase access to pre/post exposure preventative care, and to standardize early linkage to medical care within 48 hours of testing positive. They also have many community outreach efforts.
  - g. In Butler, the PA State Department of Health offers testing (located in Monarch building). JHF would like to collaborate with agencies in Butler to identify those living with HIV/AIDS and to ensure they are receiving medical care and other services. They are also interested in agencies that could provide services to their consumers. The service does not have to be specific to HIV/AIDS, for example, it could be a housing services.
  - h. If you are working with someone positive for HIV/AIDS you can contact Jim Smith at CCR who can connect them with JHF services.
  - i. Electronic copies of JHF information and services will be distributed.

- VI. Lisa Miller, Adagio Health-Strengthening Families Program for ages 10-14
  - a. For both parents and youth.
  - b. For ALL families, not just families in crisis.
  - c. Free seven-week program beginning in March 2019. Is at YMCA from 5:30-8:00 and includes dinner. It is extremely interactive and childcare for children under 10 is provided.
  - d. Highlights are to decrease risk factors and increase positive interactions between parents and kids.
  - e. Allison Gall is accepting referrals.
